SUMMER PROGRAM @ Willow Hill School Information Sheet

Beginning this *coming* summer, *July 8 through 26, 2024*, Willow Hill School in Sudbury, MA is offering a three-week Summer Program

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

What is the Goal of this Program? – to support current Willow Hill School students, grades 6 through 11, academically by reinforcing core ELA and math concepts in order to improve overall retention of academic subjects. This program will additionally support the continuation of building their social/emotional development through a variety of group-based activities.

Who is eligible to apply? – During the first year of offering this program, only current 6th through 11th grade students are eligible. We are focusing on our current students, knowing exactly what they need to be working on in order to provide a smooth transition to the Fall of 2024.

What is the tuition cost? – this 15 day program cost is \$5,656.65 as set by MA Operational Services Division. This rate is annually set on July 1 and could change the cost shown above.

What is the deadline for applying? – February 1, 2024 with a 50% deposit of \$2,828.33 in order to assure attendance. We will need a minimum of 10 students to run the program. If this minimum is not met, your tuition payment will be refunded.

If a Summer Program is listed in my child's I.E.P., will my school district pay the tuition? — The parent must contact their district to make this financial arrangement with our School's CFO, Colleen Morris. If this publicly funded commitment is made after the February 1 deadline, you need to pay the deposit and be reimbursed by either the Willow Hill School or your district.

What are the academic and social/emotional components of this program? – Three 45-minute periods of ELA, Math, and Tutorial; two 45-minutes of Electives, and one group activity daily. Similar to the school year, students will have the opportunity to implement their social/emotional skills during breaks and lunch.

How will the students be grouped? – by academic and social/emotional challenges.

Will the parents receive an assessment of the progress my child has made during this Summer Program? – Yes, as well as your school district, if publicly funded.

Who will be the teachers? – The teachers will be the current ones who have been teaching your child this past year.

What about lunch? -- Lunch will continue to be the same as during the academic year, bringing a nutritious lunch and snacks for breaks from home.

What about transportation? – Getting to and from school will also continue to be the same as during the academic year, with parents responsible for providing transportation. Drop off time is between 8:30 and 8:45, with pickup at 2:00.

Will the School be taking students off campus? – For this first year, all classes and activities will be on campus.
